- <u>"C" or Better</u>: English Composition I and II, and all HPRO, DFST and EDSE courses must be completed with a grade of C or better in order to graduate.

- Electives may be required due to double dipping.
- An official degree audit is required for graduation. Students must meet with an academic advisor to request a degree audit.
- Non-certification degree requires at least 120 hours, 2.00 UNT, a 2.50 Overall and a 2.50 Major GPAs for graduation.
- Secondary certification degree requires at least 120 hours and 2.75, UNT, Overall, teaching field, and education GPAs for graduation.
- Students seeking certification must be admitted to the Teacher Education program prior to enrollment in Professional Development courses.
- Admission to Teacher Education requires: Appropriate THEA scores, 60 earned hours, 2.75 overall GPA & 2.75 UNT GPA,
  official degree audit with certification track, completed application to the Teacher Education program turned into the College of
  Education Student Advising Office, Matthews Hall 105.
